# Fighting organized crime: the power of systematic searching

## A search strategy covering all aspects of gangs, criminal networks and organized crime

With the help of the systematic search methodology from HTA, and by building on previous efforts, as well as by involving experts from different disciplines, a complex, multifaceted and exhaustive search strategy was created within the framework of a Swedish government assignment.

The aim was to create a search strategy that can identify all relevant studies on preventive or law enforcement efforts against gangs, criminal networks and organized crime. The search strategy will be of use in different research areas, e.g. social services, criminology and police research. By developing and sharing this search strategy, the aim is ultimately to facilitate researchers' work and hopefully contributing to the existing knowledge base in the field.

#### Substantial rise of organized crime highlights need for evaluation of interventions

In Sweden, the incidence of gang-related crime and various manifestations of networked criminal activities has increased significantly in recent years.

Extensive efforts to combat this societal issue have been initiated, underscoring the importance of their evaluation.
